#### **Elder Reflection**



Will, Amy and I drove down to Tipton to experience the eclipse in totality. It was a beautiful day and Tipton had a great city park where we set up to view the eclipse. If their bathroom facilities would have been open, it would have been perfect. The mood was kind of earie as the moon moved into position to block the sun. The color of everything felt like a tornado was about to hit and the temperature dropped at least 10

degrees. When the moon completely covered the sun, the cheers of the crowd went up and the streetlights came on.

What truly amazed me was the power of light. When looking through our eclipse glasses, you could see a quarter of the sun was blocked by the moon but that had little affect on anything. When ¾ of the sun was blocked, it was still light outside and the day seemed normal. It wasn't until there was only a sliver of the sun still exposed that the colors and mood changed, and as long as there was even a diamond speck of sun showing, it was still daylight. Not until the last tiny speck of sun was covered did the streetlights need to come on. And the moment that little diamond of light was exposed again, there was daylight and the streetlights turned back off.

I was reminded again of the power of light. No matter how much darkness you add, it doesn't change the light, but add a little light, and darkness retreats. Darkness is simply the absence of light, and a little bit of light changes everything.

For me, that little bit of light that changes everything is the hope we find in Jesus Christ. The darkness of war in Ukraine and Israel, the darkness of our political divisions in the United States, the darkness of confusion that is consuming our culture, the darkness of selfishness, the darkness of personal and societal failure; adding more darkness does not affect the amount of light. But turning up the light causes the darkness to retreat. As followers of Jesus Christ, we are beacons of light in the darkness. We are the bearers of hope in a darkening world. And our light does not come from us. It comes from the hope of Easter in our midst. Hope from the fact that life wins. Hope from the fact that the worst thing is not the last thing. Hope from the fact that God is in charge of realizing our hope, not us.

May you find a little extra courage to brighten your light and watch the darkness retreat.


