Lenten Disciplines



We are in the season of Lent until Easter on April 20. Lenten disciplines are an opportunity to help us grow in our faith and remind us of the gift of life that comes to us in Jesus Christ. First, the Worship Team invites you to continue reading through the Gospel of Luke with them. Read your emails or pick up a printed reading schedule on the welcome table. Secondly, put your small purple cloth in a

place you will see it regularly and be reminded to prepare your heart and mind for Easter. Some may choose to use the cloth as a bookmark in their Bible. Others may fasten it to their bathroom mirror to remind them to pray every morning and evening while they brush their teeth. Others may tie it to their key ring or attach it to their phone to remind them multiple times a day of the sacrifice Jesus made for them to give them access to heaven. Choose a good place for your ribbon as a simple reminder that brings to mind what Jesus has done for you.

Pastor Reflection



Thank you again for the time to be with Amy and her brother for the last few days of his life on earth and again for the time to be in Kentucky for his visitation and funeral. Will and I were asked to serve as pall bearers for the funeral and were happy to do so, but with how this particular funeral home director planned things, it meant we sat together in the front row of the church during the funeral and were some of the last to leave. There was a good crowd at the funeral, and as they were dismissed, they gathered

and visited in the halls. That is when Amy's cousin Kenny, a fellow pall bearer, leaned over to me and said, "Do you hear that? Do you hear the people greeting each other and visiting, talking and even laughing? You don't hear that at funerals of non-Christians."

After taking a moment to think and reflect, I had to agree with him. A cloud of sadness, fear and loss covers the funeral service of the non-Christian. It is an ending, a brokenness, in which the person lost the battle of life and death. While sadness and crying are still a part of the Christian funeral because the relationship we had with the person has ended, the atmosphere remains one of hope and life — there is visiting, talking and even laughing. We know our Savoir lives and He promised to come to us and bring us home. For those in the faith, we know death is not the end, but a transition into a new life — life without pain and death. Instead of sadness, a Christian funeral is defined by hope and therefore we respond differently. That is the way it is supposed to be. In 1 Thessalonians 4, Paul says, "We do not want you to be uninformed, brothers and sisters, about those who have died, so that you may not grieve as others do who have no hope." We grieve, but we grieve differently because we have a hope and a promise non-Christians don't have.

Personally, I cherish the opportunity to be present at the funeral dinners our congregation hosts. There I get to witness family being family with even more greeting and visiting and talking and laughing than in the halls after the funeral. It is a time to see stories being told, hope prevailing, and life continuing. It is yet one more place where the presence of Jesus and His promises change everything.
