Palm Sunday, April 13 – Holy Week begins with Jesus parading into Jerusalem to the cheers of the people. In honor of that event, we will gather in the Fellowship Hall before worship and then parade into the sanctuary cheering the goodness of Jesus.

The complete meal of chicken hashbrown casserole with salad and drinks is provided as we remember Jesus' Last Supper with His disciples and then move to the sanctuary to honor Jesus' sacrifice that we might be forgiven.

Easter, April 20 – Easter is considered the holiest day of the year as we remember and celebrate Jesus' resurrection from the grave. Don't miss it. It will be a day of joy as we proclaim freedom from death, freedom from the grave, and a freedom to live in love.

With Easter coming in a few weeks, I wanted to share an Easter Devotional with you.

While Christmas celebrates the birth of Hope, its Easter that brings the sacrificial gift in Christ that was born in that hope. For Christians, the painful crucifixion of Christ can be difficult to embrace. The more we dive into Christ's journey the more we will

understand the profound love that was poured out on the cross. It would be so much easier to deny the excruciating details, the betrayal, the horrific torture, and the weight of grief that comes with understanding Christ's death. "Reflecting Easter: Living and Understanding the Resurrection" by Stacy Voss is 40 short devotionals that lead you through the Easter story. While reading I discovered so many new layers to the Easter story. This one particularly opened my heart.

Mark 14:65 Can you imagine being slapped, spit on, hit while blindfolded? I cannot comprehend that level of pain. If this was me, I would be in fear and unable to form a thought, let alone talk. Yet Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." Luke 23:34
