What is the most important part of worship? Being on the Worship Team and being a worship leader, I ask myself this question regularly. What is the core of worship? Personally, I put the most time into preparing the sermon. Instruction that helps us learn more about God and more about us in relation to God is an important part of

worship. But is it the most important? Singing our praises to God is important because it is when the people are actively worshipping, actively praising God for who God is and what God has and continues to do. Prayer fits in that category too (especially when the people are praying and not just the minister), because it is actively connecting with God. Communion is a time of intimacy in which each person has a chance to touch and be touched by God. Where do Children's Moment and Special Music fall? What about the offering when we get to bring our gifts to God? Does "the most important part" simply depend on the individual and how they relate to each aspect of worship?

This is just me talking, but from my perspective, the most important part of worship is the moment you acknowledge anew that you are not God. Singing praises and praying to God is vital because it is an acknowledgment by the one singing and praying that they are addressing God, and therefore are not God. The message and communion are moments when you realize there is more than just you, your thoughts and your experience to listen to, connect with, and submit to. I think the core of worship is about proclaiming at least every week that life is about more than just me, more than about how I feel, more than what I think, more than how I was brought up and how I look at the world. The core of worship is to say, "There is a God and it is not me!"

I know it sounds silly, but we live in a country and a world that revolves around the individual and caters to them. "The customer is always right." "That is just how I feel about it." "You can't tell me what to do or how to think." Worship is proclaiming there is more than just me. There is One more powerful than me, One wiser than me, and One I give authority over me. The beginning of worship is the simple proclamation "There is a God, and it is not me!" See you in worship, my wise friends.
